The Message

The phrase the 'Little Society' and the 'Big Society' have jumped out at me as I assembled this magazine. David Cameron has promoted his idea of the 'Big Society' from before the election and continues still to do so. But what is it?

Well my interpretation is, a society where we don't rely on the state we generally help ourselves, using volunteers, local groups and organisations. I suppose it's analogous to the dreadful business speak of the 90s and the word 'Synergy' which referred to an outcome that was bigger than its constituent parts for example $2+2=5$. The suggestion is that by working together in communities we can achieve more than we can as individuals, and indeed it is an idea with much merit and in the right circumstances delivers good works.

There is however more than a suggestion that crazy Health and Safety rules and other Red Tape gets in the way which does put people off at times!!

But dare I say it Mr Cameron this is not a new idea. St Matthew's Gospel Chapter 25 v31-46 is the story told by Jesus of the day when the Son of Man comes again in glory and he sorts the Sheep from the Goats. The sheep are those accepted into everlasting life and the goats are those given to everlasting punishment, a bit 'Fire and Brimstone' you may think but just stay with me while I take it a little further.

The sheep are those people who feed the hungry, quench the thirsty, clothe the naked, heal the sick, visit the prisoners. The Goats are those who look after themselves alone.

All Jesus is pointing out is that in life there are two ways we can behave, the selfish way or the way that considers, helps and works with others. In v40 he says 'when you help the least of your brothers and sisters you are helping me'

So we as Children of God have two choices, the way of the Sheep (God's Way) and the way of the Goat (another way). We make our own choice and we must accept the final consequences of that choice.

But for most of us the idea of helping others is embedded by God in our very beings, it's what we are, it's not such a hard choice at all. I therefore conclude that the idea of the 'Big Society' is very much using this quality. It is a natural development of us as God's Children and it's because of him we carry it through, not because of party politics, doctrine or an election pledge.

Let's cut through the red tape, do it God's way and help our own communities.

Nocton Parish Council

March 2011

The Police reported no crimes had been committed and no complaints from the Nocton Hall area had been received since LEDA took back security responsibilities.

Our Dog Warden had reason to caution the owner of a dog that had fouled a public footpath and dog owners are all reminded to use the bins provided.

The Councillors agreed to invite the Directors of Nocton Dairies and LEDA properties to informal discussions on where we are now and the way forward.

Peter Askew (Chair Village Hall) reported that he had a very successful meeting with a representative from NKDC regarding funding available for Village Hall projects.

The proposed meeting for the **Parish Plan** (see page 5) has been moved to **April 20** from **7pm – 9pm**. This is an opportunity for everyone in the village (whatever their age), to put forward ideas for our village and help shape its future.

The Meeting in April was also the Annual Parish Meeting - the Chairman highlighted the main events of the past year, as we are all aware this was dominated by the proposal for a Mega Dairy by Nocton Dairies, which has now been withdrawn. Her full report is available from Doreen Green, Parish Clerk.

Alan Brown (LCC Highways) was present to give a report on issues affecting the village and apologized for the lack of action to date. New contracts and Contractors are now in place and Mr Brown is to have a walk through the village with a Parish Councillor to list the requirements we have to date.

Cliff Baxendale arrived with an example of the "masks" to be made and carried by Nocton and Potterhanworth residents as part of the Sapphire Celebrations. Unfortunately due to lack of communication this was the first official approach to the Parish Council and although posters have been erected around the village, there was been a poor turn out, with some parishioners annoyed at the method of advertising the event. However after an excellent explanation of the forthcoming festival on 28 May, the Parish Councillors were able to fully endorse the event.

Wedding Celebrations – sadly we are unable to go ahead with a Nocton Celebration on 29 April, it appears most people have already made their plans and the various licences/approvals would be hard to get at such short notice. However "a dry run" for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee next year, is being held on September 3rd - a Hog Roast. So please put this date in your diaries now.

What do you love most about this village?

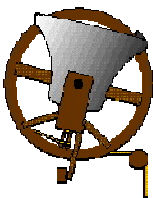
Imagine a time in the future when we have become a thriving and active community with people of all ages helping to make it so. In this future; what do you see happening in the village and what are you most proud of having achieved?

It is also planned that a Full Peal lasting approx 3 hours will take place on the bank holiday Monday, 2nd May, to celebrate the Royal Wedding.



A History of Nocton Church - Part 6

The Final Years of Building.

Architect of All Saints Nocton.

At Nocton, Scott chose to imitate the 'Early Decorated' style of c.1300, then regarded as the 'best' period of Gothic architecture. Built with no expense spared, the church was probably begun in 1860, being consecrated on December the 16th, 1862 and dedicated to All Saints: this was a new dedication, for previous Nocton churches had been dedicated to St. Peter. It was chosen in honour of Lord Ripon, whose birthday was November the first, or All Saints Day.

All Saints church, however, was not quite complete when Lady Sarah died in April 1867. A south aisle and south porch had been included in the original design, and these were added in 1872 by her son the Marquess of Ripon 'as a tribute of reverential affection to his mother'.

The Marquess, a deeply religious man as well as a successful Liberal politician, was at this time a leading Freemason: but two years later he suddenly announced his conversion to Roman Catholicism, though he apparently returned to the Anglican church before his death in 1909. He is buried in the magnificent Victorian church of Studley Royal, near Fountains Abbey, North Yorkshire. This 'sister church' to All Saints was built by the Marquess in 1871-8, as a memorial to his brother-in-law Frederick Vyner, who was murdered by Greek brigands. It is well worth a visit, as is the sombre and indeed rather sinister church of Christ the Consoler at Skelton-cum-Newby, North Yorkshire, also built during the 1870s in memory of Frederick Vyner.

The Marquess sold the Nocton estate in 1889, but before he did, he financed the finishing touches to the furnishings of All Saints. These provoked many admiring comments, which sum up the spirit behind the building of Nocton's church, and indeed of the Victorian Gothic Revival it so admirably typifies. 'We cannot take our leave of Nocton', enthused the Lincoln Diocesan Architectural Society in 1872, 'without referring to the detail, both of the church itself, and of its furniture. Nothing has been neglected or regarded as too insignificant to deserve reverential care. Would that there were more parish churches in our great diocese where the ruling principle was as markedly the determination not to give the Lord of that which doth cost them nothing'.

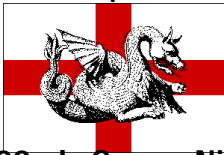
